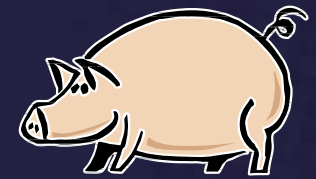

Who should enrol?

Persons involved in the management and daily care of pigs should consider enrolling. This includes owners, managers, piggery staff and technical services providers.

Why should you enrol?

- Enrolment in PigLink gives you access to experts in all fields of pork production.
- You get to share in their insights and to ask questions of the experts, all from the comfort of your own home, office or piggery.
- PigLink allows you access to an educational opportunity without having to worry about time off from work, travel time and cost or biosecurity concerns.
- Participation involves just one hour of your time every two months and you can spend that time in your home, office or piggery.

Are there limits to the number of enrolments?

Yes. There are only 100 toll-free telephone lines available for each session.

How does the program work?

- At least one week prior to the scheduled session, participants will be able to download the presentation from a web address that will be supplied by email. You can then access the e-seminar using a username & password that will be emailed to you on enrolment.
- On or before the day of the scheduled session, participants should view the presentation, preferably with all piggery staff.
- On the day of the scheduled session, participants will call a toll-free number to participate in the 30-45 minute 'Question and Answer' session that follows viewing of the presentation. This will be at 12.30pm SA time.
- Over the 5 days following each scheduled session participants can continue to ask the speaker questions via e-mail (paul.hughes@sa.gov.au).
- All telephone and e-mail questions and answers will be emailed to users 1-2 weeks after the scheduled date for each session.

Are there limits to the number of people per site?

No. Enrolment is based on one dial-in telephone line. With speakerphones you can have any number of people gathered around the computer screen and telephone.

Does participation require internet access?

Yes.
